

Consciousness and Unconsciousness

There is a part of the equation often overlooked by paranormal researchers. While we acknowledge the connection to the brain and the “mind” that paranormal experiences may influence, few of us take into account “consciousness, or unconsciousness. And while consciousness has always folklorically been associated with the brain, it may be that our consciousness doesn’t even reside in our body at all. Instead, out consciousness may exist in the Zero Point Energy Field, and remains connected to us via a silvery thread, much like reported in many near death experiences. If this is so, it may be that when we dream, in certain cases we may be able to transcend some of our perceptive boundaries.

Dreaming

What if when we meditate, enter a trance or zone out, we peek into the other realms of reality? We may also do this when we dream. I mean after all, wasn’t Edgar Cayce called “The sleeping prophet”?

Sociologists who have studied indigenous cultures have documented numerous cases of dreaming being a vital element of shamanistic methods and techniques. Native American Medicine men will tell you frankly they enter another realm to perform their medicine. I don’t believe you have to be a shaman, however, to experience this. Often we dream about other worlds, other times, or even about talking to people near and dear to us who have come to us in our dreams to give us guidance and messages. In fact, my own family has a history of getting important information from members who have crossed over with a high degree of accuracy.

Due to the fact that so many instances have been documented of people who experience things that have not yet happened, and then they do in later in their waking moments, plus a variety of other experiences lead me to believe that in our dreaming state, particularly in Lucid Dreams, we enter into other realities, or universes with our other self, our dreaming body, which I believe is our quantum body or spirit essence. I also believe it is our consciousness, or even our unconscious consciousness, and that we are attached to our physical bodies through our consciousness via a tiny umbilical cord...

I also believe it happens to us from time to time in our waking moments. We skim the surface of an alternate reality when we know who is calling us after only the first ring of the phone (a kind of psychic caller ID) or when we get a bad feeling about someone seconds after we meet him or her. I personally have heard the voice of my father in my head scolding me about something I have done. Is this the result of a guilty conscious or the product of active consciousness? All of these things may indicate the overlapping of realities and may hint at the survival of consciousness without the human shell to encase it.

Some scientists now believe that the art of dowsing involves the ability to sense wave and particle emissions associated with the subject of the dowsing. While I disagree with this notion, it is certainly something that should be explored fully. Remote viewing may involve tuning in to a specific fundamental frequency upon which the information viewed is recorded. In my medium experiment (on the Research page) we encountered what may in fact be evidence that medium do just exactly that when they get their

information. Psychics may tune into these frequencies during a reading and pick up the information they seek. While this may be due to the subjects involved having a specific electromagnetic hypersensitivity that makes them sensitive to these emergent information carriers, there may also be some type of biological receiver at work.

To a degree, we can extend this notion into the entire spectrum of paranormal activity; a telepathic impression or past life experience may just be the result of receiving a source of information embedded on a field of emissions. I am experimenting now with methods of measuring this emission and identifying it and its source. This has led to the theory of worm hole activity as a conduit for paranormal phenomena. It is a long row to hoe so to speak because the possibilities seem endless and each type of phenomena has to be explored individually.

If paranormal activity operates on a different frequency than our own resonance, and evidence is beginning to suggest that this may be so, then we have to look at it with practical approach. We have normal examples of this all around us. A dog can hear frequencies beyond the frequency response of the human ear. Snakes and other animals have the ability to see into the infrared spectrum, seeing the heat signature of another living being/creature. Sharks and eels are hypersensitive to changes in electrical fields and many insects perceive ultraviolet light. Birds can fly vast distances every year and end up at the same destination, without a road map. We, on the other hand, generally lack these extraordinary capabilities. Or do we?

Amazingly, there ARE some humans who have extending hearing ranges, sensitivity and hypersensitivity to EMF fluctuations; ability to see auras and plasmatic orbs, while the rest of us cannot. So, what we recognize as a psychic, is a person with an enhanced perception. So now, all of my psychic friends are going to be flooding me with e-mail. Maybe this will lead to a career in psychic analysis.

Not!

Well known investigator Joshua P. Warren wrote in his book "How to Hunt Ghosts", that nothing we see is really solid. While he is fundamentally flawed in this aspect of his thinking, probably due to a lack of education in physics more than anything else, he is correct when he goes on to say that when we look at matter, what we are really seeing is the reflection of light off of that matter (by the way Joshua, it still doesn't alter the four states of matter simply because our sight perception is based on light reflection). While It is a misconception that something composed entirely of light must be translucent. Something composed entirely of light is...well...light. And we only see a very small portion of light, what we call the visible light spectrum. It is also important to remember that light is EMF.

Everything we see is not composed entirely of light, or the lack thereof. Instead, our sight process requires light in order to work. We have several other senses and one of those, touch, will certainly verify that a falling piano targeting for your head is not just a reflection of light; it is solid mass.

Also according to Joshua, seeing a ghost is no different than seeing a physical person. He goes on to compare the abilities of a ghost to the operation of magnetic lines of force, allowing it to interact in the physical world in much the same fashion. An example

he cites is to take a magnet and place it under a piece of paper. We can't see the magnetic field. But, if we add a bunch of iron filings sprinkled over the paper, the map of the field becomes visible to us, much like a materializing phantom. And while this comes across as a very common sensical statement, it is full of holes and lacks any shred of evidence to back it up. Now I don't want to seem like I am picking on Mr. Warren here, because I am not. Joshua has done a great deal to further the field of ghost hunting. But in this aspect, the evidence doesn't support the claim. But let's follow this out. He also points out that just as the human body is made up of cells, the ghostly body is made up of free floating static electrical charges called ions. Ions are invisible, but you can still witness their effects on the environment. I am sure you have experienced hair rising up on the back of your neck and the backs of your arms (static electricity) cold spots or chills, three-dimensional apparitions, and moving objects. You may never see a ghost, but you can certainly experience and measure the changes in the environment that its energy provokes. However, there is far more to this than meets the eye. If these interactions are the result of consciousness using a wormhole to travel from one universe to another, the environmental changes caused by the emergence of this wormhole would explain elevated ion counts, radiation bursts, light bursts, temperature shifts, cold plasma orb generation, barometric pressure drops in a highly localized area, emerging EMF, changes in relative humidity, gravity, air conductance, static charge increases and time fluctuations or anomalies, all of which would normally manifest in the presence of such a phenomenon. Ghosts may simply be the manifestation of the consciousness of the dearly departed manifesting itself on the holographic boundary of the wormhole as a projection of itself as it was in life. Oh, and about those "residual haunts"? It is more likely that because a wormhole not only can connect two places in space, it can also connect two places in time, that we are actually viewing that historical event as it happens, in the time it happens, through the holographic boundary of this wormhole. So if our consciousness is the source of all the electromagnetic emissions from the brain, this energy will continue on as awareness in the form of pure energy. So this may be the Rosetta Stone of evidence, plain and simple, or a potential "Proof Positive" that aspects of life can and does exist in realms non-physical to our own. What we can measure physically is only one layer of the proverbial onion. Only this onion and the layers are potentially near infinite.

So can we quit now?

Absolutely NOT!

Whether energy is syncing up, emerging in a coherent pattern from the Zero Point Field, sailing upon a morphogenetic field, bobbing in a sea of quintessence, or traveling from one universe to an adjacent one via a worm hole conduit, there is fertile, dynamic ground for the movement of energy between our physical world, and the world of the paranormal. This world may lie within the confines of an adjacent universe based on energy, not matter, with different laws of physics than ours. Since we have pretty well exposed the very real probability that matter can and does disappear from one state of existence to another, then why don't we see more ghosts, UFOs and Bigfoot?

Most of us are limited to our five senses. But there is a sixth sense. Studies at Duke's Rhine Research Center in the past has indicated that everyone has this sixth sense, with their ESP experiments. Some of us have a more developed sixth sense than others do. The rest of us are doomed to only receiving these signals when

crosstalk occurs. Or, is there hope for all of us dead heads on the horizon? So it seems. Can all of us foresee the future? Do we all have precognitive ability? In a forthcoming issue of the Journal of Personality and Social Psychology (JPSP), Cornell psychology professor Daryl Bem has published an article that suggests you can, possibly more often than the 25 percent of the time on average you might expect just by chance. His paper entitled "Feeling the Future: Experimental Evidence for Anomalous Retroactive Influences on Cognition and Affect," presents evidence from nine experiments involving over 1,000 subjects suggesting that events in the future may influence events in the past, a concept known as "retrocausation." In some of the experiments, students were able to guess at future events at levels of accuracy beyond what would be expected by chance. In others, events that took place in the future appeared to influence those in the past, such as one in which rehearsing a list of words enhanced recall of those words, with the twist that the rehearsal took place after the test of recall.
